

Over 50 Driver Safety Course Offered in Batesville

August, 2007 - Batesville, Ark. - White River Health System Foundation's (WRHS) Primetime League and AARP will sponsor a Driver Safety Program on Wednesday, September 19th from 1 pm to 5 pm.

This half day class will be held in The Josephine Raye Rogers Center for Women and Imaging Conference room B at White River Medical Center located at 1710 Harrison Street in Batesville.

The AARP Driver Safety Program is the nation's first and largest classroom refresher for motorists age 50 and older. It has been taught in Arkansas for over 25 years and has been proven to improve driver safety for older adult drivers. In addition, insurance companies are required to provide a discount on automobile insurance for drivers over age 55 who have completed the course. The class will be presented by Jerry Taylor, AARP volunteer instructor.

The fee of \$10.00 per person covers the cost of materials. No tests are given and the completion certificate will be valid for three years.
